

Managing Complexity in Major Projects

Introduction

"THE Malaysian construction sector is recovering from the global financial crisis and is expected to peak between the third and fourth quarter of this year on the anticipation of a full rollout of three mega projects, says HwangDBS Vickers Research.

The mega projects are the RM2 billion Low Cost Carrier Terminal, to be sited about two kilometers from the KL International Airport in Sepang, Pahang-Selangor Water Transfer and Light Rail Transit (LRT) extensions." - The Star, 6 Jan 2010

Complexity means many different things to different people, and is rapidly becoming one of those overused yet much misunderstood pieces of terminology. It can include the multifaceted nature of stakeholders, diversity of requirements, the intricacies of multi level systems design and architecture and the challenges of integration, test and acceptance.

In this one day program, we would like to share with you the Singapore experience on the implementation of the massive rapid transit projects. One of the major areas to be covered extensively is Procurement and Contract Management. This includes how procurement decisions are to be made, selection of contractors and types of contracts to be utilized.

It is also important to note that the strategy of multiple contracts will introduce additional coordination and interface issues among separate contracts. Therefore, the management tools used in managing multiple contracts will be deliberated.

In addition, participants will leave the program understanding how the contracts are to be administered, which covers performance reporting, payments, claims administration, and records management.

In 1994, Mr. Tan was engaged by the Sri Lanka construction authority as a Consultant under a World Bank funded industry development program. He was also the General Manager of a major Singapore precast building contractor handling more than S\$150 million of project work in Malaysia and Singapore.

Mr. Tan has delivered in lectures on various subjects related to the construction industry in China (including Hong Kong SAR), India, Taiwan, Malaysia, New Zealand, Singapore, Sri Lanka and Thailand in the last 15 years. He founded the Asian Concrete Construction Institute (ACCI) with fellow professionals from both private and public sectors in China, India, Malaysia, Singapore, Sri Lanka and Thailand in 2003 and has served consecutive terms as the Secretary General of the ACCI.
